**FIRST READING** *Lv 19:1-2. 17-18* 

A reading from the book of Leviticus

The Lord spoke to Moses; he said: 'Speak to the whole community of the sons of Israel and say to them: "Be holy, for I, the Lord your God, am holy.

"You must not bear hatred for your brother in your heart. You must openly tell him, your neighbour, of his offence; this way you will not take a sin upon yourself. You must not exact vengeance, nor must you bear a grudge against the children of your people. You must love your neighbour as yourself. I am the Lord."

### **SECOND READING** 1 Cor 3:16-23

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple.

Make no mistake about it: if any one of you thinks of himself as wise, in the ordinary sense of the word, then he must learn to be a fool before he really can be wise. Why? Because the wisdom of this world is foolishness to God. As scripture says: The Lord knows wise men's thoughts: he knows how useless they are, or again: God is not convinced by the arguments of the wise. So there is nothing to boast about in anything human: Paul, Apollos, Cephas, the world, life and death, the present and the future, are all your servants; but you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God.

### **GOSPEL** *Mt 5:38-48*

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You have learnt how it was said: Eye for eye and tooth for tooth. But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. On the contrary, if anyone hits you on the right cheek, offer him the other as well; if a man takes you to law and would have your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away.

'You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. For if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.'

### Reflection 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A

Dear people of God

As I was going through the readings of today, my mind was flooded with thoughts of moments, through my nine-teen years of priestly ministry, I had to resolve issues between those who had been hurt deeply and those who had hurt them,— issues between husband(s) and wife(s), parent(s) and child(ren), brother(s) and sister(s) and other types of relationships. I have had occasions where I was faced with resolving this issue within myself, where people had hurt me too. The only solution to such problems, the only encouragement to forgive and keep loving those who hurt us, is to take God at His words—to do it because He said we should do it—despite our feelings and desires. For it is not wisdom, in the ordinary sense of the word, not to offer the wicked person, at least, a defensive resistance. I see no human wisdom in turning the other cheek when we are hit on the other, to offer your cloak as well to someone who tries to snatch away your tunic from you, to go two miles willingly, when under oppression and suppression, we are ordered to go one mile, even more, to love and pray for our enemies. But these seemingly foolish actions in the sight of worldly people, are what we are commanded, by Jesus in the today's Gospel, to have as habits—ways of life.

St Paul, in the second reading says: "Make no mistake about it: if any one of you thinks of himself as wise, in the ordinary sense of the word, then he must learn to be a fool before he really can be wise. Why? Because the wisdom of this world is foolishness to God. .... So there is nothing to boast about in anything human" Yes, the human person, each of us, has nothing to boast about. Jesus said in St John's Gospel: "It is the spirit that gives life, the flesh is of no avail; the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. But there are some of you that do not believe." (John 6:63-64a).

To practise the love of neighbour to the point of loving our enemies and praying for their good – not praying that they be repaid evil for evil nor be punished for their evil deeds – is really a difficult life style. But it is made easy if we allow the word of God in all its richness to find a home in our hearts, homes and communities, (see Col 3:16). All our fighting back, offensive self-defence, avoidance techniques, are all our way of proving that we are worth something. However, we are worth nothing but what the Spirit-Word has made us and to the extent we have allowed Him. Not doing those things might seem to make us appear weaklings. But it shouldn't. God wants us to stand boldly in condemning and ending evil rather than giving in or condoning it. In today's first reading, God says: "You must not bear hatred for your brother in your heart. You must openly tell him, your neighbour, of his offence; this way you will not take a sin upon yourself. You must not exact vengeance, nor must you bear a grudge against the children of your people. You must love your neighbour as yourself. I am the Lord."

Jesus said, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." (John 8:31-32). If the Word lives in us, then it will be seen that we, as individuals and as Church, {domestic (the family), the local, and the universal Church}, are the temples of the Holy Spirit. We have to realise that we are God's temple and that the Spirit of God lives within us, and therefore, we are sacred – holy (see 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading).

Since we were created in God's image and likeness, and through baptism, have become his adopted children and members of Christ's body, with His Spirit living among us as in a temple, God demands that we live as sacred temples. In today's first reading, He says: "Be holy, for I, the Lord your God, am holy." And in the Gospel, Jesus enjoins us: "You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect." The word 'holy' {'qodesh' ('qadosh') in O.T. Hebrew or 'hagios' in N.T. Greek} means separate, set apart or sacred. From what Jesus said in today's gospel, it could mean 'distinguished, excellent, outstanding, exceptionally good, exemplary, etc. St Paul advises us saying: "I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. **Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds**, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect."

I came across this interesting passage from the booklet titled Francis of Assisi: CTS Great Saints Series written by Jannifer Moorcroft, (2009 p.37.)

### **Holiness of Francis**

Francis once chanted a very special Office (prayers of the Church) with Brother Leo. He told Leo to chant: "Brother Francis, you have committed so many sins during your life in the world that you undoubtedly deserve hell." Brother Leo sang: "And you now do so much good that you will certainly go to heaven."

Francis told him he had to repeat what he had said, not make up words of his own, and continued: "Brother Francis, the sins you are guilty of against the Lord of Heaven and Earth are so great that you deserve to be damned through all eternity." Brother Leo sang: "And you will make, thanks to God, such progress in virtue that you will deserve to be blessed through all eternity." Annoyed, Francis told him that by holy obedience he must repeat his words exactly, and continued: "Miserable Francis, tremble for not having found grace in the Lord's sight, for you have gravely offended the God of all good and the Father of all consolation – and you must respond that it is perfectly true that I am unworthy of pardon"

"Very well", replied Brother Leo, "I will then respond that God whose goodness is still greater than our sins will assuredly pardon you." Francis then asked him why he did not respond as he was told, and Brother Leo replied" "My father, God is my witness, that I try to repeat your words, but Our Lord Himself puts other words into my mouth"


